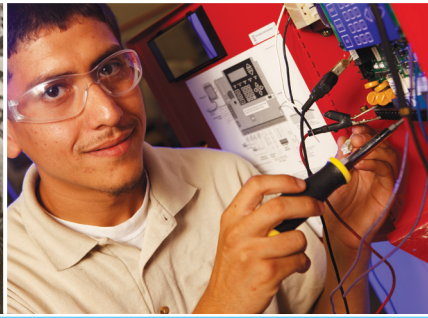


JEVS HUMAN SERVICES

Founded in 1941, JEVS Human Services is one of the largest private, nonprofit organizations in the Delaware Valley region and proudly serves individuals from all walks of life who face physical, developmental, and emotional challenges, as well as the hurdles of unemployment and underemployment. We serve nearly 23,000 individuals annually, giving them the tools to achieve their personal and career goals. By providing job skills training, career management, vocational rehabilitation, recovery services, adult residential and day services, and personal care assistance in the home, JEVS Human Services enhances the quality of life of those who may not be able to achieve it on their own. Much of our work is made possible through federal, state, and local government funding coupled with private, foundation, and corporate contributions.

What We Do

Skills Training, Job Readiness, and Career Services

Through our Skills Training, Job Readiness, and Career Services programs, we help dislocated workers, the underemployed and unemployed, seniors, youth, ex-offenders, refugees, and others by offering skills assessment, training, and job placement. This includes welfare-to-work programs and other career-related services such as counseling, testing, job search, and outplacement.

We operate Orleans Technical Institute, which provides training in a variety of in-demand fields including building trades, human services, telecommunications, and court reporting. We pioneered the development of specialized assessment tools distributed internationally through our Vocational Research Institute.

Vocational Rehabilitation and Recovery Services

Our Vocational Rehabilitation and Recovery Services enable us to provide psychiatric rehabilitation, community learning experiences, and employment programs for individuals with physical and intellectual/developmental disabilities and mental illness. We offer substance abuse treatment programs for adults seeking support to overcome addiction.

Adult Residential and Day Services

Our person-centered Adult Residential and Day Services programs for individuals with physical and intellectual/developmental disabilities and mental illness are tailored to help each person reach his or her highest potential in life and integrate as fully as possible into the community.

In-home Personal Assistance

Through our In-home Personal Assistance Services, we help people who are aging or have a range of physical disabilities to maintain their independence in their own homes, and manage and direct the delivery of their own care.

- 590** youth participated in SAT/ACT test prep, college planning and tutoring

- 371** new Americans enrolled in refugee services

- 3,221** inmates and ex-offenders received training to promote a smooth transition into society

- 6,252** welfare recipients worked toward economic independence

- 5,577** people maintained independence with personal care assistance

- 224** individuals were provided with home modifications to improve accessibility

- 32** individuals regained independence by transitioning successfully from nursing homes back into the community

- 209** individuals with intellectual disabilities or mental illness thrived in residential and day services

- 92** people maintained independence with non-medical, in-home personal care

- 43** youth benefitted from compensatory education services
